You can bet this young lady figures fishing a Senko rigged Wacky Style is a good way to go. Ericka is the daughter of Scott Wolf, one of the top guides in the Pacific Northwest. Scott often favors wrapping a rubber band around the center of his Senkos for Wacky Style fishing.



You can always rig Wacky Style like this if you choose to do so, but many experienced anglers say you're better off using a band on your Senko.



If you actually pierce your Senko with your hook this is what might happen to your worm after a fish has grabbed it.
